## SCCA Lifts Suspension on Kumho Ecsta V710 Tire

TOPEKA, Kan. (July 7, 2004) - Sports Car Club of America, Inc.'s Board of Directors voted Tuesday to lift the suspension placed on the Kumho ECSTA V710 tire for SCCA-wide competition.

The vote came after independent tests confirmed the tire's performance specifications set by the Department of Transportation (DOT).

Kumho had discontinued and collected the tires this spring, citing "inconsistent test results relating to tread splice and tread area > durability." SCCA followed Kumho's lead, suspending the tire from competition in all programs on April 6.

The tire is again eligible for SCCA Club Racing and Solo competition, effective immediately. Competitors can tell if they have the approved Kumho ECSTA V710 by the inclusion of Polyester in the sidewall as part of the construction. The discontinued, unapproved tire does not list Polyester on the sidewall.

## Savannah Solo Schedule Changes

After a slow start at the beginning of the year the Savannah Solo II group is up and running. There have been a few minor changes to their originally announced schedule.

Don't worry, you haven't missed out on much of the fun. There are five events still remaining. They are:

August 28 - Roebing Road; September 19 -

Hutchinson Island; October 31 - Roebing Road; November 28 - Hutchinson Island; December TBD - Jekyll Island.

Which brings us to our next incident.

As we gear up on the Grid towards the one and go, we ask that crew members not dressed in

sleeved shirts, long pants and closed shoes step towards the back of their car as their car or the one directly behind them become hot. This is a safety measure to reduce injury with incidents like the above. After I approached one crew person with my request, she complied, but I managed to offend a steward in the process. Apparently, the dress cover up went against that steward's personal dress code. I would like to thank the rest of the stewards, Kaye Fairer and Sara Snider for helping out with that incident.

Shortly after the steward incident, Mike collapsed in Medical and was transported to the Emergency Room at St Joseph's. I thought Mike would be working Pit Road at the Big Track in Heaven for a short time there. A very special thank you to Dr. Kirk Shultz and to Mike's two rescue workers. I am ashamed I cannot recall their names. They were wonderful ladies. After four liters of fluids and

rest, he is back to his normal 'must see your credentials' self. I would like to thank Bob Hayward for stepping up to the plate and graciously taking over Pit Road for us on Monday while Mike recovered.

Monday, group six dawned with crewmembers concerned over rumors of 'take outs' during the race. We passed all the information along to proper officials and then we enjoyed an exciting race. There were a couple of accidents, but in that group, it would have been unusual for there not to be.

I would also like to end with a thank you to Rick Mitchell, Sara Snider and Kaye Fairer for helping us out with Mike's hospital run. I would also like to thank Jack and Vicki Abbott for bringing our van and the kids to us, and sitting with me in the ER waiting room. Thanks to Richard and Kaye McCloy for helping with the kids. Where else can you find friends like this?

The minutes of the May meeting were approved.

Julius Ashley reported that the Jacksonville Solo had another great event with 80 entrants at the June event. They have purchased four new radios and are continuing to update their equipment.

Ted Migchelbrink gave the Savannah Solo group report. The new equipment trailer is in and the old one has been sold. The next event for the Savannah Group is Sunday July 18<sup>th</sup> at Hutchinson Island. The August event will be the 28<sup>th</sup> at Roebing Road. They look forward to a big turnout for the Roebing

event. They will also be planning a work day to finish off the inside of the new trailer. That will be announced at a later date.

Ted Migchelbrink gave an update on the track as Kaye's brother is not doing well and they could not attend. The concrete work has been done for the tire vendors and now Hoozier wants a pad also. We are also looking at the feasibility of a paving fund drive and will need a chair for that also.
